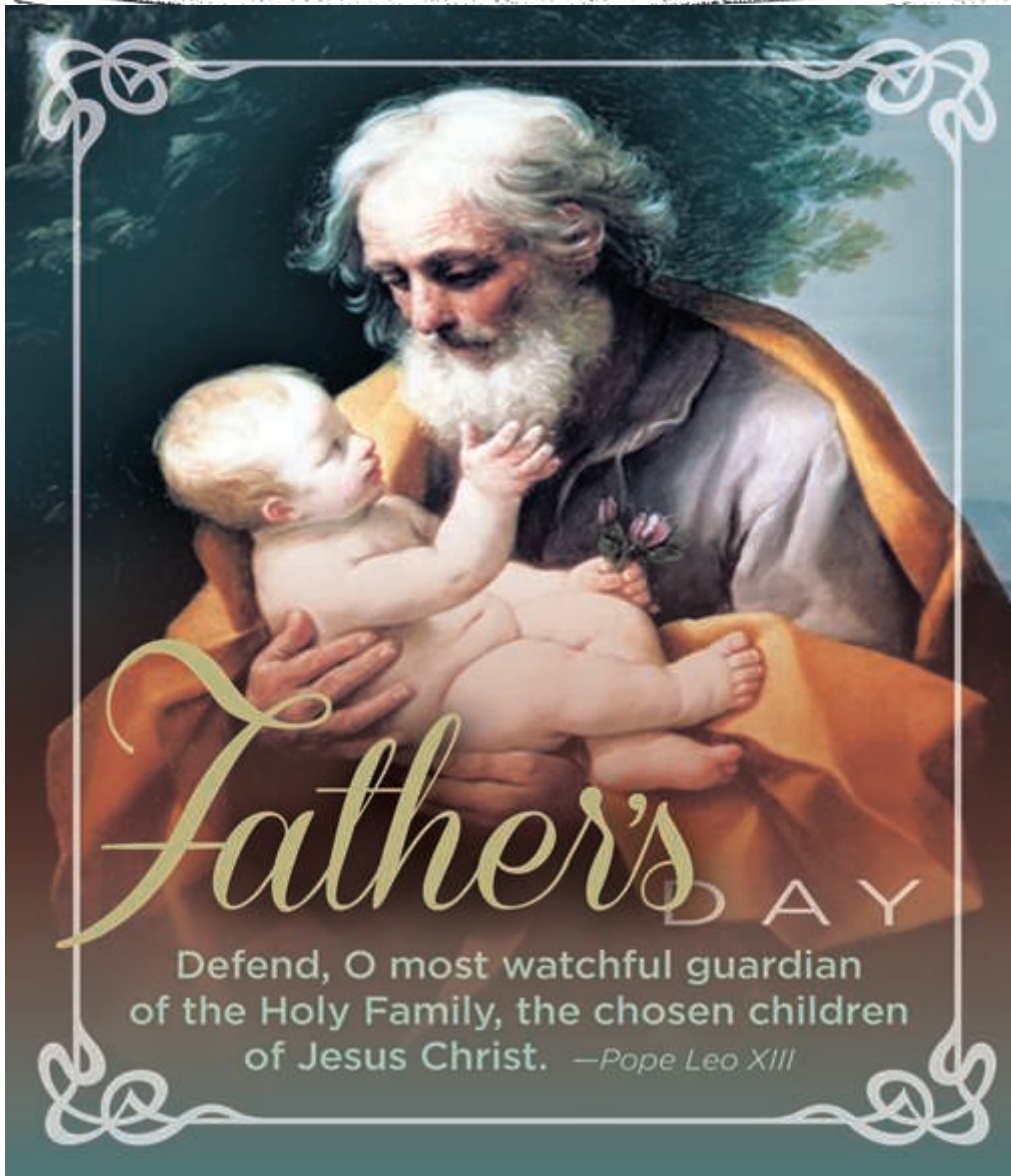

My Good People...

Our parish is excited about offering the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at a special Mass on Wednesday, June 26th at 10:30 am. As I age, I am finding out that a lot of parts are wearing out. Thank God that our Church has a Sacrament to celebrate God's loving concern and healing for those of us that are aging and the young among us who are suffering various weakening illnesses. A time of fellowship is important, so our parish is providing a Salad luncheon following Mass and Anointing.

What we are offering is not the Last Rites or Extreme Unction. The "Last Sacrament" is actually Viaticum. The name "Extreme Unction" has existed since the 12th century. In the renewal of the Second Vatican Council, the Sacrament was restored to an earlier understanding of being a help for people who are sick with more than simple illnesses that pass quickly. This Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for people who are dealing with all kinds of health issues that come to all of us as we age. I recommend that folks be anointed before surgery and during serious illnesses. Visitors are welcome to celebrate the Anointing with us, so feel free to invite your Catholic friends. Please RSVP to DeAnna at the Parish Office by Monday, June 24th so we can get an accurate lunch count.

I will be in Rochester this week attending the Presbyteral Assembly. This Archdiocesan gathering of Bishops and priests takes place every other year. This weeklong gathering allows us to be enriched by speakers, work with our Archbishop on a variety of issues, and also have time for fellowship with old friends and get to know new ones. This will be my third Assembly and I am looking forward to it. Please pray for the Bishops and priests of the Archdiocese.

Thank you to all the folks who have helped prepare the old rectory for demolition. It was a majestic building in its day! I wish we had some stories of its planning and construction. I am so pleased that people are taking pieces of it to use or repurpose. Thank you! The old rectory will get new life in the homes of our people!
